**SHORT ROAD TUG BERTH PROJECT - EXTENDED**

**Date:** 27 July 2017

**Refer:** NTM 110 (T) and is cancelled

**Details:** Mariners are advised that the Short Road Tug Berth Project consisting of pile driving activities and Jetty construction has now been extended to 10 September 2017.

The pile driving activities and construction work will be carried out by Geotech Pty Ltd via a land based crane and then the jetties will be built progressively from land.

Geotech will place four solar flashing light buoys between channel beacons 33 and 35 to delineate the worksite from river traffic. The jetty pile will also have warning lights installed at close of works each night.

Further details can be obtained from Melbourne VTS on VHF channel 12.

**Mariners are advised to exercise caution when navigating in the vicinity of above operations.**

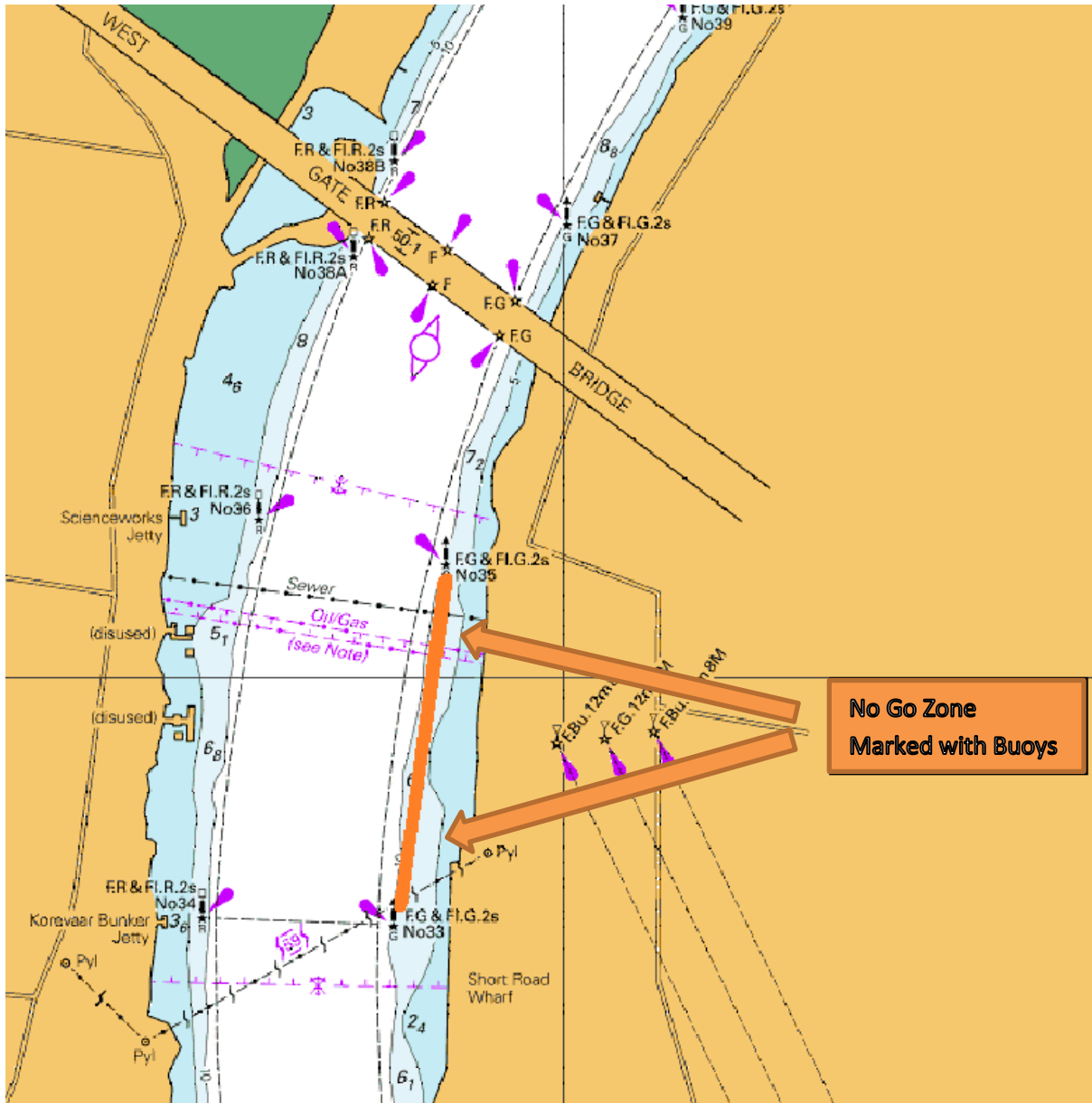
